EDC monitors federal, state, and local public health communications about COVID-19 regulations, guidance, and recommendations.

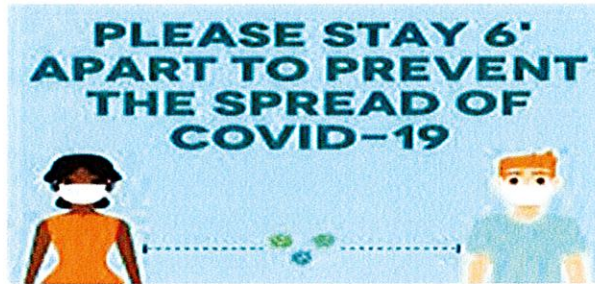


EDC is doing our part in preventing the spread of COVID-19 in our workplace, we are restricting access to our office for anyone who may have recently been exposed to the virus. If you are sick please do not enter. By entering this office, you are affirming and attesting that you have not, in the last 14 days, had any close contact with anyone who is either confirmed or suspected of being infected with COVID-19, including anyone who was experiencing or displaying any of the known symptoms of COVID-19.

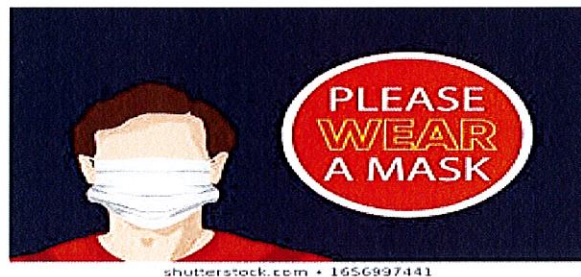

Due to the spread of the COVID 19, EDC will do a temperature screening for those who enter the EDC office. This will be done with a non-contact forehead thermometer. Anyone refusing required testing will be denied entry into the EDC office area.



While in our EDC office area we request that you social distance, stay at least 6 feet (about 2 arms lengths) from others.



If you cannot social distance a mask (must cover your nose and mouth) is required. If you do not have a mask one will be provided for you. If you cannot wear a mask/face covering due to medical reasons, deafness, religious beliefs, or difficulty breathing you must social distance.



If you need to cough or sneeze cover your mouth/nose with a tissue and properly dispose of the tissue. Wash your hands with soap or hand sanitizer (hand sanitizer is provided for your use).





EDC discourages handshaking. We encourage other noncontact methods of greeting be used.
